We live in a new world. We live in a global village where places like China and Palestine are a few hours away. Our work is also multiprofessional; we work alongside experts from many professions and workstreams, both in reality and virtually. Consider for a moment the people who you work with every day – for those in the clinical field, the team is often made up of operating department practitioners, doctors, nurses, health care assistants, and allied health professionals such as blood transfusion specialists, radiographers and physiotherapists. Academics consistently work with lecturers from varied fields, clinicians from varied fields, businessmen from varied fields and other public sector workers... from varied fields, and from varied countries.

WE LIVE IN A WORLD OF BARRIERS AND BORDERS.

The aim of this conference is to breach these borders and provide knowledge, insight and understanding into the work of professionals from several different disciplines, and different countries, and how the work they do relates to perioperative care. The basic principles of caring for a patient in England, China or Gaza should be the same, and therefore, we should be able to learn from each other's experiences. A trachea in Nanjing, China is likely to be similar to a trachea in Ormskirk, UK. Therefore the problems of difficult intubation, or the preparation of patients for anaesthesia should be similar.

This conference covers several different topics including managing difficult airways, transferring critically patients, managing post traumatic stress disorders, working for a charity overseas, caring for perioperative patients in China and Gaza, the developing role of blood banks, and maintaining professional standards and autonomy.
