

- 5/6 year full time undergraduate programme

- Primary Medical Qualification leading to provisional registration with the GMC
- Quality assurance from the GMC (Stages 1-8)
- Contingency School – School of Medicine, University of Liverpool
- “Spiral” Curriculum

- Professional values and behaviours



Including biomedical sciences, diagnosis and medical management, psychological and sociological principles, clinical research, healthcare services/systems, health promotion and illness prevention







# Entry Requirements

- AAA at A-level to include A-level Biology and Chemistry
- Or
- A\*A\* B or A\* AB including Biology and Chemistry at Grade A or above
- At least five GCSEs at Grade B/6 or above (or equivalent) including Biology, Chemistry, English Language and Mathematics

# Additional Requirements

- Must take a **UCAT Medical Admissions Test** *prior* to application
- Multiple Mini Interviews (MMI) form part of the selection process
- Offers are subject to:
  - Satisfactory health clearance
  - Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) Enhanced Disclosure



# UCAT

- Not knowledge based test
- Measure of verbal reasoning, decision making, quantitative reasoning, abstract reasoning and situational judgement
- Practice examples provided on website ([www.ucat.ac.uk](http://www.ucat.ac.uk))
- Can sit test at local test centres
- Funding provided to cover costs (subject to meeting UCAT-specified criteria)
- **We cannot accept an application without UCAT**

- To support widening access to medicine

# MBChB with Foundation Year

- Equip students with the skills, knowledge and understanding to prepare them for progression to medicine
- Develop knowledge in biosciences, health systems, public health and local healthcare needs, acquire the skills needed to develop personally and professionally and build confidence and resilience



# What will I study?

- Science for medicine
- Health, Health Systems and Public Health
- Clinical Perspective from a Multi-Disciplinary Team

## Approach

# Entry Requirements

- BBB at A-level – must include Biology (B) and Chemistry (B)

OR

- ABC at A-level – must include A or A\* Biology or Chemistry and at least a B in Biology and Chemistry

OR

- A-level/BTEC Combination: BB at A-level (Biology and Chemistry) and D in BTEC Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma or National Award

OR

- International Baccalaureate: 32 points to include Biology and Chemistry

AND

- At least five GCSEs at Grade B/6 or above (or equivalent) including Biology, Chemistry, English Language and Mathematics

# Widening Access Criteria

Candidates **MUST**:

Have lived in the Northwest of England for at least one year prior to application

AND, one of the following two points:

1. Have attended a non-selective state secondary school for GCSE where attainment 8 score is below the England average
2. Have attended a non-selective state secondary school for GCSE and live in an area with a postcode deemed to be deprived

AND

One of the additional widening participation criteria listed in the entry requirements



# Additional Requirements

- Consistent with direct entry into the MBChB
- Must take the UCAT Medical Admissions Test *prior* to application
- Multiple Mini Interviews (MMIs) form part of the selection process
- Offers are subject to:
  - Satisfactory health clearance
  - Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) Enhanced Disclosure
- *Selection mirrors that for MBChB*
