

# Routes into Teaching – Early Years (3-7), Primary (5-11)

- BA (Hons) Primary Early Years QTS\* a three year programme for those who wish to train to be a qualified teacher, working in nursery, reception or KS1 classrooms.
- **BA (Hons) Primary Education with QTS \*** a three year programme for those who wish to train to be a qualified teacher, working in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 classrooms
- UG degree in any discipline (including those outlined above) + PGCE Primary Early Years Education with QTS\*
- UG degree in any discipline (including those outlined above) + PGCE Primary Education with QTS\*



# **Routes into Teaching – Secondary Education**

#### **Directly into undergraduate**
