

Your classification – Integrated Masters Degree

If you are in your final year and have passed or been condoned in **all** modules, we will calculate your classification in two ways.

1. Average Percentage Mark (APM)

Your APM is calculated from your Level 5, 6 and 7 modules, using the ratio 20:30:50. This means:

- Level 5 modules contribute 20% to your classification
- Level 6 modules contribute 30% to your classification
- Level 7 modules contribute 50% to your

classification The lowest mark, to the value of 20 credits, is

discarded.

Your APM is classified under the following bands:

APM	Classification band
70-100%	First Class Honours
60-69%	Upper Second Class Honours (2.1)
50-59%	Lower Second Class Honours (2.2)
40-49%	Third Class Honours

For example, an APM of 61% is classified as 2.1

2. Your profile of marks

If you miss a classification using the APM calculation, we will consider you for the higher classification based on your profile of marks, provided you meet the following conditions:

- at least half your credits are in the higher band, and
- at least 60 of these credits are from Level 7, and
- your APM is **within 2%** of the higher band

Please note:

Award boards have the discretion to condone failure in up to 40 credits across Levels 5 and 6, and 20 credits at Level 7. However this is only applied to non-core modules where the module mark is at least 30% for Levels 5 and 6, and at least 35% for Level 7. Condonement is discretionary, please do not rely on it.
