Dear student,

Many thanks for considering to study with us here at Edge Hill University. Within this document you will find the class options (modules) for any students wishing to study with us here during the academic year 2019-20. The catalogue is broken down into the various subject areas and is also broken down into levels of study and class availability. In order to help you explore the catalogue please read the guidance below.

UK Universities levels of study

Standard undergraduate degrees in the UK are 3 years in length. Once a student has completed their 3 years they will graduate with a degree in their chosen subject field.

Level 4 = 1st year of degree studies

Level 5 = 2nd year of degree studies

Level 6 = 3rd year of degree studies

Post Graduate

Once students have completed an undergraduate degree they can apply for postgraduate options. This may be post graduate teaching qualification (PGCE) or a masters programme, both of which can be 1 or 2 years.

Level 7 = Postgraduate degree studies

Class choices (referred to as modules)

Module codes will provide you with an idea of which level of study that class will be at. The further you progress through a degree the more substantial the workload and assessment becomes. Below shows the codes for the classes i.e. LIT1000 is a 1st year Literature class

1000 = 1st year of degree studies

2000 = 2nd year of degree studies

3000 = 3rd year of degree studies

4000 = Postgraduate degree studies

During their studies, UK students at Edge Hill will take 60 UK credits per semester (120 Credits per year) which equates to full time studies. For many students this means taking 3 x 20UK credit classes per semester. This is the minimum we recommend incoming Erasmus+ students to take. We do, however realise some student may need to take more. We will endeavour to support students who wish to take 80UK credits (4 x 20UK credit classes) per semester but students must be aware that they will have over 30% more workload than UK students. We won't allow students to take more than 80 UK credits per semester.

Please note - 20 UK credits = 10 ECTS credits

Students can only take classes within their own subject area and within the partnership agreement between institutions.

Please consult your ERASMUS+ advisor at your home institution as to how UK credits are translated back to your institution.

Scheduling

All ERASMUS+ students timetables will be handled by departments via the Learner Agreement. Please note all students are required to provide a signed Learner Agreement to Edge Hill prior to the start of their studies.

Learner Agreements are the responsibility of the incoming student and partner university.

When choosing classes from the catalogue

Please make sure that you provide us with the module code and full title on your Learner Agreement

Please make sure you consider the correct semester the module runs in - Semester 1 = Fall, Semester 2 = Spring

Please consider the level of study of the class

Please consider any pre-requisites attached to some of the modules

Approval of course at your home institution is the responsibility of the applicant

Credit transfer

As the ERASMUS+ programme works across many countries we do not convert or transfer credits for your home institution. This is the responsibility of your home institution. We provide all students with a transcript of results that outline UK credits achieved during your studies with an explanation of how the ECTS are reflected.
