THE HUB

A space to meet, relax and belong. You'll find the Hub at the centre of campus and it's the perfect place to grab a bite to eat and socialise with friends. Home to Subway, Costa, Morrisons Daily and the EH Market, there are plenty of outlets to choose from to recharge in-between lectures.

SPORTS CENTRE

We offer some of the best sporting facilities in the region that are fully accessible and contain excellent provision for both indoor and outdoor sports. Football courts, rugby pitches, sports halls with spectator galleries, athletics track, hockey pitch, 25-metre pool. And our state-of-the-art Fitness Suite offers a range of Technogym cardiovascular, fixed resistance machines and free weights.

THE ARTS CENTRE

ST JAMES' CAMPUS

A small number of our courses are offered at our St James' Manchester campus. Located just a couple of minutes' walk from Manchester Oxford Road train station and ideally surrounded by a wide range of shops, cafés, restaurants and bars.


SHOPPING

THE NORTH WEST

Your student experience doesn't stop when you leave campus – There's plenty to enjoy with your friends within easy reach.



With gig venues, sports grounds, nightlife, walks, beaches and more within reach, whatever your interests you won't need to go far to find it. Here are some of our favourite day trips within an hour of campus.



LIVERPOOL

Start your day soaking up the culture and atmosphere of the city – think the Albert Dock, famous Cavern Club and Liverpool's two cathedrals to get started. Then head to one of the many museums to learn more about the city's heritage or watch a theatre show. Later, you can enjoy a meal in one of the hundreds of restaurants across the city, ready to spend the night enjoying the famous nightlife or heading to a gig in one of the many venues across the city.



CROSBY

Start your morning with a beachfront stroll or spend the day in Crosby enjoying lunch in one of the many nearby restaurants, bars and cafés. You could even head to Mersea Sauna to enjoy an authentic Scandinavian sauna and cold plunge overlooking the Sefton Coastline, followed by live music and locally sourced food in The Lake House restaurant. In the evening, you can watch the sunset while sipping on a cocktail in the Bus Yard bar overlooking the marina. Enjoy an evening in the surrounding bars or head to the Plaza Community Cinema to catch the latest film.



FORMBY

Start the day with a bracing walk in Formby's Pinewoods (and spot some red squirrels), then watch the waves come in from the famous Formby sand dunes. Head into Formby town centre for brunch in one of the many popular spots (you might even see some famous faces). Make sure to stop to enjoy the sunset on the beach before heading back to campus.



We'd also recommend exploring Burscough, Southport, Birkdale and even a trip to Aintree Racecourse for an incredible day out.

While there are plenty of new places to choose from, everyone's favourite comfort foods such as McDonald's, Greggs and Domino's are right on your doorstep!




IF YOU LOVE LIVE EVENTS...

Experience the thrill of high speed karting on over 650 metres of fast track at Kartworld. Designed by racers and technicians from the British Touring Car Championship, the track is great for fun racing and for the more serious karter.
- 2. UK Paintball - Ormskirk**
The Ormskirk woodland provides an ideal setting for paintball, with lots of natural obstacles which enhance the experience.
- 3. Farmageddon - Ormskirk**
A fun and exciting way to bond with new friends. Farmageddon is officially one of the best scare attractions in the UK with multi-award-winning scare mazes and attractions.

- 1. Westhead Village Hall - Ormskirk**

Our law students can experience an authentic courtroom as they practise cross-examination techniques and prepare to give evidence in our moot court room.



REASSURING PATIENTS

Nursing and film students collaborated to create videos designed to encourage more patients with learning disabilities to take up health screening. Filmed in our Clinical Skills and Simulation Centre, the new video guides were designed to inform and reassure patients who find visits to the doctor intimidating.

HIGH-TECH RESEARCH

Our brand new £17.4m Life Sciences building is home to research laboratory spaces, a microscopy room, nitrogen laboratory and more.

Sports students can explore biomechanics and performance analysis in our physiology and psychology labs. As well as make use of our dedicated strength and conditioning area, rehabilitation centre, kinesiology facilities and sports therapy clinic.



CAMPUS AND BEYOND

Your learning won't be confined to the Edge Hill campus. Depending on the subject you're studying, you'll be taking part in trips, visits and fieldwork. For most courses, you can choose to spend a semester or year abroad.

HOW TO GET TO OUR ORMSKIRK CAMPUS

Thinking of commuting to Edge Hill? No problem. We're situated in a great location so we're easily accessible by multiple modes of transport.

CAR

If you're planning to drive to university, you'll be able to park in our car park, free of charge. But you'll need to apply for a parking permit, which is subject to you meeting our eligibility criteria. You can help the environment and guarantee yourself a space by taking part in our car share scheme, which will also save you money by splitting travelling costs with a friend.

BIKE

Another option for you to consider is cycling. Not only is it good for the environment, it's also good for your health. Here at Edge Hill, you can become a member of the Bike Locker Users' Club (BLUC) to store your bike in any of the BLUC lockers on campus. Or you can use any of our Sheffield stands and wall-mounted racks free of charge.

BUS AND TRAIN

Ormskirk has its own bus and train stations within walking distance of our campus. So once you're there, you'll be just a 10-minute walk away from your studies. Even better, you don't need to walk. We have our very own Edge Link Bus (EL1) which can collect you from Ormskirk bus station and bring you directly onto campus. What's more, it's free with your student ID.

And a good tip for those of you who choose to travel by train is to buy a 16-25 Railcard. This will save you a third on each journey. Are you a mature student over the age of 25 planning to study full time? You're still eligible to apply for this Railcard so you can save on travel too. Make sure to look out for any other travel passes that can help you to save money on your journey.

COMMUTING TO MANCHESTER ST JAMES'

The St James' campus is ideally located on Manchester's Oxford Street, close to rail and bus networks. Your closest train station is Manchester Oxford Road and your nearest tram stop is St Peter's Square. And don't forget about the Manchester Bee buses too. If public transport isn't for you, there are plenty of parking options in and around Manchester for you to access.



STUDENT FINANCE AND SCHOLARSHIPS

TUITION FEES FOR UK STUDENTS

Our standard tuition fee for a full-time undergraduate degree or integrated Masters starting in 2026 is £9,535 each year. The maximum tuition fee chargeable is set by the Government and subject to parliamentary approval.

HOW TO FUND YOUR DEGREE

Most students pay their tuition fees with a tuition fee loan from Student Finance England which is paid directly to your university. Some students choose to fund their studies independently and don't apply for a tuition fee loan.

You may also be eligible for a maintenance loan which you can use to pay towards housing and living costs. This is means tested, so the amount you receive depends on your parent or guardian's (household) income. BURSARIES, GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

You may be able to get a bursary or grant to help support your studies. Before you join us, you can apply for our Sports Scholarships. Once you begin your studies, you'll be eligible to apply for many more of our scholarships, that celebrate the determination, commitment and achievement of Edge Hill students: ehu.ac.uk/scholarships

Money Advice

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU GRADUATE?

Your tuition fee and maintenance loans are repayable, but you won't need to make any repayments until after you finish your course, and your earnings are over a threshold (currently £25,000 per year). You'll only repay a small percentage of your earnings above the threshold.

For example:

If you're on a £30,000 annual salary, you would repay 9% of your earnings above the £25,000 threshold. This works out as less than £10 a week.

BUDGETING AND FINANCE

Sort out the money so you don't have to worry. It's better to work out how much you'll need to live on before you get to university. Once you're confident about what you can spend, you can concentrate on what matters to you.

Here are a few things to think about as you plan for your future.

WORK OUT WHAT YOU'LL GET FROM STUDENT FINANCE

You're likely to be eligible for a loan to cover your tuition fees and this will be paid directly to your chosen university. But you'll need to plan for your living expenses.

A maintenance loan can cover some of these costs, however, the amount you get will depend on your household income.

You can use the Student Finance Calculator to work out how much maintenance loan you're likely to receive:

Don't forget to check if you're eligible for any bursaries, scholarships or grants too.



WHAT ABOUT LIVING COSTS?

The cost of living in the North West of England is cheaper compared to the South East or London. What about the typical living costs in Ormskirk?

- Weekly rent in halls - **£93 - £175**
- Average cost of a pint - **£3**
- Takeaway pizza - **£8**
- Meal in a restaurant - **£10 - £18 per meal**
- Gym Membership - **£10 per month at Edge Hill Sport** (based on £120 annual pass)
- Edge Link bus service - **Free travel** from campus to Ormskirk town centre
- Groceries – **around £30-40 per week**

TOP TIPS:

- Your student loan will be paid to you in three instalments, so you could work out your budget for each term and then see how much money you'll have to spend for each week of that term.
- You can use a budgeting app to manage your money or set spending limits on your online bank accounts, so you don't overspend.
