

Car

We're close to the M58 and M57 and connected to other major motorways, so it's easy to plan your route here. We have parking on campus and drivers can apply for a permit, subject to eligibility. If you participate in our car share scheme, you can guarantee your space on campus while saving money by splitting travel costs with a friend.

Bus and train

Ormskirk's bus and train stations are within walking distance of campus with regular connections to Merseyside, Lancashire and Manchester. You can also use our EdgeLink bus that runs regularly between Ormskirk and our campus during term-time - all you need to do is show your Unicarid.

Bike

Not only is cycling good for the environment, it's also good for your health. Students can become a member of the Bike Locker Users' Club (BLUC) to store your bike in any of the lockers on campus or you can use any of our Sheffield stands and wall-mounted racks free of charge.

The North West

Your student experience doesn't stop when you leave campus.

With gig venues, sports grounds, nightlife, walks, beaches and more within reach, whatever you're interested in you won't need to go far to find it. Here are some of our favourite day trips within an hour of campus.



Liverpool

Start your day soaking up the culture and atmosphere of the city – think the Albert Dock, famous Cavern Club and Liverpool's two cathedrals to get started. Then head to one of the many museums to learn more about the city's heritage or watch a theatre show. Later, you can enjoy a meal in one of the hundreds of restaurants across the city, ready to spend the night enjoying the famous nightlife or heading to a gig in one of the many venues across the city.

Crosby

Start your morning with a beachfront stroll or spend the day in Crosby enjoying lunch in one of the many nearby restaurants, bars and cafés. You could even head to Mersea Sauna to enjoy an authentic Scandinavian sauna and cold plunge overlooking the Sefton Coastline, followed by live music and locally sourced food in The Lake House. Then you can enjoy an evening in the surrounding bars or head to the Plaza community cinema to catch the latest film.



Formby

Start the day with a bracing walk in Formby's Pinewoods (and spot some rare red squirrels), then watch the waves come in from the famous Formby sand dunes. Head into Formby town centre for brunch in one of the many popular spots (you might even see some famous faces). Make sure to stop to enjoy the sunset on the beach before heading back to campus.



Preston

With a direct train from Ormskirk you can start your day with a refreshing walk in the beautiful landscapes of Avenham and Miller parks. Then head to Level Preston for an action-packed visit playing a few games of bowling and some arcade games with friends. Football fans can watch a match at Preston North End Football Club, and then finish the trip at one of the many bars and restaurants across the city.



We'd also recommend exploring Burscough, Southport, Birkdale and even a trip to Aintree Racecourse for an incredible day out.

1. Aintree Racecourse - Aintree


Just a short train journey away, Aintree Racecourse hosts world famous race days and also plenty of events and live music throughout the year.

Funding your studies

When applying to university, it's important to get your Student Finance application in as early as possible. We recommend applying as soon as it opens, as you can easily make changes to your application later if you need to. Also, look out for scholarships you might be eligible for that could boost your income and employability.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees are the fees your university charge for your course. Most students pay their tuition fees with a tuition fee loan from Student Finance, which is paid directly to your university. Some students may choose to fund their studies independently and don't apply for a tuition fee loan.

Maintenance loans

You may also be eligible for a maintenance loan, which you can use to pay towards housing and living costs. This is means tested, so the amount you receive can depend on your parents'/guardians' (household) income. To check your eligibility and to find out more about student loans visit:

Repayments

Tuition and maintenance loans are repayable, but you won't need to make any repayments until after you finish your course, and your earnings are over a set threshold. You'll only repay a small percentage of your earnings above the threshold. Visit ehu.ac.uk/tuitionfees for a full breakdown of repayments.

For example:

If you're on a £30,000 annual salary, you would repay 9% on your earnings above the £25,000 threshold. This works out as less than £10 a week.





Making your money go further

Managing your money matters, especially when the cost of living can feel like it's creeping up.

1. Work out your living costs

It's important to work out how much you'll need for your fixed living costs. This could include things that are generally the same cost each month like:

- * Petrol/travel
- * Accommodation
- * Phone bill
- * Subscriptions
- * Utility bills (if these aren't included in your rent)

Next, work out your day to day spending - these are extra costs that aren't fixed each month. This could be:

- * Groceries
- * Social life
- * Takeaways
- * Clothes and personal items

Once you've worked out your living costs, you will have a better idea of what you might need to cover your costs.

2. Work out your income

You'll need to work out your income to budget for your living costs, and this could come from a few different areas.

A maintenance loan can cover some of these costs, however, the amount you get will depend on your household income. You can use the Student Finance Calculator to work out how much you're likely to receive: www.gov.uk/student-finance-calculator

Another source of income could be a part-time job, which is a great way to top up your income alongside your studies. Plus, our careers team can help you find something suitable.

Specialist facilities

We've invested heavily in making sure our students have access to industry-standard equipment and learn in an environment that prepares them for work.
