### Study Abroad Catalogue 2023-24

Within this document students will find the class choices (modules) available for the academic year 2023-24. The catalogue is broken down by subject area, level of study and class availability. To help explore the catalogue, please read the guidance below.

At application stage, students are asked to provide a list of the 8 classes which they would like to take, this must be approved by their home institution. Classes must be listed in order of preference and be correct in line with the catalogue. Module code and title must be included. Choosing 8 classes allows us to be flexible when planning their studies with us. Many students choose classes across years and subject areas, which can result in potential timetable clashes. However, we do endeavour to approve student's 1st class choices on their application where possible. During the months leading up to their studies, we will work on class schedules. Students will be given your final timetable upon arrival at Edge Hill.

#### When choosing classes from the catalogue, students should:

- \* Include the module code and full title on the application.
- \* Check which semester the module runs in (Semester 1 = Fall, Semester 2 = Spring).
- \* Consider which level of study the class is at.
- \* Take note of any pre-requisites attached to modules.
- \* Remember that gaining approval of modules by the home institution is the student's responsibility.
- \* If choosing Full Year modules students must be here for both semesters to take the module.

#### NB - only use this catalogue to choose modules, do not use the Edge Hill University website.

Module codes will provide students with an idea of which level of study that class will be at. The further students' progress through a degree the more substantial the workload and assessments become. See the codes for the classes below. i.e., LIT1000 is a 1st year Literature class.

1000 = 1st year of degree studies

2000 = 2nd year of degree studies

3000 = 3rd year of degree studies

4000 = Postgraduate degree studies

#### **UK University Levels of Study**

#### Undergraduate

Standard undergraduate degrees in the UK are 3 years in length. Once a student has completed their 3 years, they will graduate with a degree in their chosen subject field.

#### Postgraduate

Once students have completed an undergraduate degree, they can apply for postgraduate study. This may be a postgraduate teaching qualification (PGCE) or a master's programme, both of which can be 1 and 2 years.

Level 4 = 1st year of degree studies

Level 5 = 2nd year of degree studies

Level 6 = 3rd year of degree studies

Level 7 = Postgraduate degree studies

UK students at Edge Hill take 60 UK credits per semester (120 credits per year), which is the equivalent of full-time study. For many students this means taking 3 x 20 UK credit classes per semester. This is the amount of credits we recommend are taken. However, we do realise some students may need to take more. We will endeavour to support students who wish to take 80 UK credits (4 x 20 UK credit classes) per semester, however, please be aware that this will result in over 30% more workload than UK students. We do not allow students to take more than 80 UK credits per semester. Students should consult the Study Abroad advisor at their home institution to find out how UK credits are translated back.

#### **Credit Transfers**

As the Study Abroad programme works across many countries, we do not convert or transfer credits to home institutions. This is the responsibility of the home institution. We provide all students with a transcript of results that outline UK credits achieved during their studies.
